

Under *The Oil and Gas Conservation Act*

Battle Creek West Milk River Gas Pool
Battle Creek West Second White Specks Gas Pool
Battle Creek West Milk River-Second White Specks Gas Pool

Pursuant to section 17 of *The Oil and Gas Conservation Act*, MRO 484/02 PO 36 dated July 23, 2002 is rescinded and the following provisions shall apply to the drilling of and production from gas wells in the "Battle Creek West Milk River Gas Pool", "Battle Creek West Second White Specks Gas Pool" and "Battle Creek West Milk River-Second White Specks Gas Pool", effective April 1, 2004.

1. The drainage unit shall be four legal subdivisions in a Section, grouped as follows:

Legal subdivisions 1, 2, 7 and 8; 3, 4, 5 and 6; 9, 10, 15 and 16; 11, 12, 13 and 14.

2. The target area shall have sides located 200 m from the corresponding sides of the drainage unit.

3. For the Milk River zone within the following lands West of the Third Meridian:

In Township 3, Range 26: Sections 19, 30, 31, and 32;

In Township 4, Range 26: Sections 5 and 6;

In Township 3, Range 27: Sections 24, 25, and 36;

- (i) the drainage unit may contain a maximum of two wells capable of gas production;
 - (ii) all wells completed or drilled after April 1, 2004 shall be located a minimum of 400 m from any other well capable of production from the Milk River;
 - (iii) no wells shall be drilled after April 1, 2004 within 200 m of the north, south, west or east boundary of the area described above, unless otherwise ordered by the minister;
4. As a minimum requirement, a single point gas well test must be performed on every gas well in lieu of the test specified in section 73(2) of *The Oil and Gas Conservation Regulations, 1985*. For a Milk River gas well, the test may be performed within three months after commencement of production, the minimum flow time should be 48 hours, and a pressure buildup is optional subsequent to the flow period.
5. Unless otherwise ordered by the minister, the wells shall produce according to good production practice as defined in subsection 2(r.1) of *The Oil and Gas Conservation Regulations, 1985*.
